# THE 2005 SEASON

Southgate Cricket Club's 150<sup>th</sup> anniversary finally arrived, bringing in its vanguard no small excitement and anticipation of events both on and off the field. The President, Peter Jouning, fulfilled a personal ambition in publishing a history of the club – not a simple A-Z of an efficient prosaic historical account but coloured by a number of differing perspectives. He deserves every congratulation for completing this crowning achievement within a tight and forbidding deadline and it has already become the accepted seminal work for the student of Southgate cricket.

The year commenced with the Club Dinner in March where a hundred members and their guests enjoyed a traditional and enjoyable meal at Bush Hill Park Golf Club, and were entertained by speeches from former England and Hampshire cricketer Robin Smith and our own Jim Conroy. Reluctant as Jim was to accept (another) invitation to speak, somehow the occasion would not have been the same without him and he couldn't fail to please. Fred Ruoff, in a short talk, introduced his guest, James Sales who was directly related to the Walker family, a timely and auspicious historical reminder to all of our generous benefactors in this, our anniversary year.

Alan Jenner masterminded a Cricket Week which was engineered to blend competition with nostalgia (if not unashamed sentimentality) where, in certain instances, thirty years of cobwebs were swept away as former players were inveigled back to the Club to enhance the celebrations. It was a particular delight to see Tony Sully after so long, but the award for endurance went to Chris "Rocket" Stevenson who played for the Club in 1980 and 1982, having covered the miles from Perth, Western Australia where he practises as a barrister - and played three times!. The invitation Veterans' match saw Tim Bishop's official retirement from umpiring at the age of 81, having joined the Club as a colt in 1938, coupled with Martin Fletcher retiring from playing at the age of 77 (after 61 years at Southgate). We nevertheless look forward to seeing them frequently in the future, albeit deservedly off-duty.

The social highlight was undoubtedly the Summer Ball, held in a marquee at the end of Cricket Week, a fitting climax to the single-minded dedication put in by Peter Jouning this year. A Beatles tribute group and a West Indian steel band put the musical finishing touches to a memorable event. Such has been the success of the anniversary that references to this on the Club's website, expertly controlled by Phil Stevens which has done so much to promote our image and facilities, has generated email correspondence from no less a person than Gary Hansen in South Australia. Gary played for the Club in the very early 1970s and was an accomplished bat and no mean leg-break bowler, and represented Middlesex II while he was with us.

Success on the field, however, was rather more qualified than perhaps on the social side. The headlines were that the 1<sup>st</sup> XI were unable to restore their place in the top division of the

Middlesex County League, finishing third, fifteen points adrift of the promoted pair, Brentham and Uxbridge. The bowling, though, was for the first time in recent years much more balanced, with four bowlers taking between 18 and 31 wickets. The sensation of the year, though, was Brayden Sutton, a 19-year-old left-hand batsman from Perth, who left Southgate's league batting records in his wake like shattered driftwood. With a top score of 172 not out against Shepherds Bush, his 902 runs far outstripped any other batsman in the Middlesex 1<sup>st</sup> XI League this summer, and has only been exceeded on six occasions in the 34-year history of the League - truly, our Wizard of Oz. Eastcote and Ickenham, who were promoted at the end of the 2004 season at Southgate's and Barnes' expense, found their tentative grip of top division status slip from their fingertips with equal rapidity, so we look forward to visiting their delightful grounds again.....but Wembley have bounced back from Division 3. Still, you can't have everything.

The 2<sup>nd</sup> XI's demise was one of those mysteries following, as it did, the euphoria of winning the championship last year before finding themselves jolted back to unfairly harsh reality by getting relegated to the 2<sup>nd</sup> division for the first time ever. So another record disappears ... Brentham proved that promotion last year was a short-lived affair, and take the drop with us, while South Hampstead maintain their free-fall plunge into Division 3. Even though he was not destined to save our bacon, our Hong Kong star Sunil Sher Lama at least meant we were not a total walkover with 30 wickets in ten matches at under 16 apiece. Currently beyond the ken of this writer, it can be seen from the table that Richmond II featured in two 3-point draws, and Stanmore and Teddington in one (!?).

The 3<sup>rd</sup> XI just managed to keep their heads above water by clinging to three robust passing logs in the river by closing the season with three consecutive wins and thereby dispatching any sceptical thoughts about Father Christmas. For this good fortune they had to thank two players in particular: Arshad Bhatti who took 17 wickets in those three games, and Andy Hoskin who in the same three games totalled 177 runs, bringing his league aggregate to a resounding 619 runs. Southgate finished four off the bottom, above – and level on points with – Finchley. Kenton 3<sup>rd</sup> XI, who stormed to promotion in 2004, found the competition literally out of their league and drop down again for 2006, accompanied by South Hampstead.

The 4<sup>th</sup> XI, in their newly elevated status in Division 2 of the 1987 League, found the going predictably less smooth than in the previous season, but the gathering maturity of the teenage players (notably Michal Wloch's maiden hundred), combined with the guiding hand of the (progressively!) older players, saw the side just about acquit itself well enough to resume the fight next season. Skipper and occasional bowler, Doug Gordon, in a timely exploitation of some damp conditions, took 8-25 against Mill Hill Village IV to contrive a win which rescued the 4<sup>th</sup> XI's season.

Brayden Sutton was head and shoulders the player of the season, which was acknowledged by his being awarded the Hawker Trophy. His aggregate of 1,490 runs came at a great pace, and as a Western Cricket Association 2<sup>nd</sup> Grade player, it's difficult to foretell what heights he may reach. Certainly his first experience of cricket outside Australia will do him no harm and we wish him success and shall look out for his progress. The other major scorers in 2005 were Jamie Jouning who scored 905 runs and Alvin Durgacharan with 839.

Faisal Mir and Sunil Sher Lama were the leading wicket-takers with 46 wickets each, and Adrian Carr was close behind with 42.

Mike Stavri ran the Fantasy League which continued to provide much pleasure and amusement and hopefully also added to individual incentive to succeed on the field of play. The added stimulus has had a remarkably favourable effect on Mike's own batting prowess. Dan Ashley's weekly results bulletins were eagerly awaited, and these have become a valuable source of historical information when compiling a publication such as this; keep up the good work, Dan, and many thanks from us all.

From a personal standpoint, possibly the least enjoyable game of cricket ever in my life was 'playing' away against Hampstead 3<sup>rd</sup> XI at the new Old Albanians Ground - until the last twenty minutes, that is, when, for all their arrogance (not counting the ESN wicketkeeper) the like of which I have never witnessed in all my 1,360 games, they were incapable of beating a near 4<sup>th</sup> XI. But on the other hand it was a privilege to be in the side in the Brondesbury III match at home when Ali Ameer, batting at nine, hit 17 fours and a six in 85 not out to deny Bron their expected win.

Other statistical snippets from 2005 included a 9<sup>th</sup> wicket club Middlesex League record partnership of 81 between Richard Bishop-Laggett (35) and Shaun Flook (31\*) for the 2<sup>nd</sup> XI away at Ealing, passing the 1<sup>st</sup> XI's 65 (unbroken) by Mike Dunn and Ian Maciver at home to Brondesbury twenty years earlier.

Interestingly (to some perhaps), the current 10<sup>th</sup> highest Club record for the 4<sup>th</sup> wicket (Jack Williams and RBL in 2003) was equalled on consecutive days (16<sup>th</sup>/17<sup>th</sup> July), namely:

4<sup>th</sup> wkt 164 (G. S. Rowe 93, O. Ali 71) 2<sup>nd</sup> XI v Richmond II (ML) (Shenley)

4<sup>th</sup> wkt 164 (D. G. Ashley 118, S. McGuinness 42) 1<sup>st</sup> XI v Ickenham I (CVL) (a)

Reflecting on the averages, a (deemed to be constructive) criticism levelled during the Middlesex League Dinner has brought about a presentational amendment. Unlike the national 1<sup>st</sup> class averages as promulgated by most cricketing publications, we are now endeavouring to be more eclectic by reintroducing 'qualifying' benchmarks so that those who play more can appear higher in the averages, etc., etc. This doesn't, however, really prevent some youngsters topping the overall season's bowling averages through the simple expedience of bowling straight, an art seldom displayed at Southgate since 1977 – oh, now that's torn it .....

Career averages are gradually being extended as time permits the research – much easier to calculate for recent players than long-standing – but please don't be disappointed if your name has not yet been filed. My own view towards the younger players is that their comparative records may breed some incentive to emulate or compete with each other to reach specific landmarks like 50 wickets or 1,000 runs or whatever, which is designed to enhance their powers of concentration .....

With the new season, we welcome a brace of new captains for the 1<sup>st</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> teams and wish them and their colleagues in the other elevens luck as we promise them our full support – don't we!

[Statistical note: for Steve Rowe's career average to drop below 30 he needs 55 consecutive ducks.]

Alan Fairbairn died on March 7<sup>th</sup> 2005 at the age of 82.

Born on 25th January 1923 in Winchmore Hill, Alan attended Haileybury School where he blossomed as a left-hand batsman, as well as being a useful bowler, becoming school captain in 1941. He joined Southgate Cricket Club in 1947 and was Southgate club captain from 1952 to 1958. He was elected a vice-president in 1959 and was Club President from 1988 to 1991. His dozen Southgate 1<sup>st</sup> XI centuries understated his ability and artistry, and he developed a notoriety for declaring with his own score in the 90s.

In professional life he became a solicitor and, to all of us who knew him at Southgate Cricket Club, was the total gentleman - modest, kind, considerate and eminently sociable. Until ill health prevented him at the end of his life, he regularly attended matches, and never missed the Annual Club Dinner.

Alan played 20 times for Middlesex (and once for MCC v Yorkshire) between 1947 and 1951 but is most notable for his unique arrival into county cricket. With Compton, Edrich and Robertson playing in the 1947 Gentlemen v Players match, Alan took his chance to score 108 in the second innings against Somerset at Taunton in his début match. Ten days later (with Compton and Edrich this time on Test duty) against Nottinghamshire at Trent Bridge he scored 110 not out in 132 minutes with 17 fours, again in the second innings. No-one has yet equalled Alan's record of scoring hundreds in their first two first-class matches. He was awarded his county cap, but his business demands restricted him to club cricket. He was also a very accomplished squash player, winning the British Amateur Championship in 1952 and 1953. His later years saw him as an active member at Bush Hill Park Golf Club.

Needless to state, Alan's funeral was hugely attended, and the subsequent reception was held at the golf club where Jim Conroy gave a typically appropriate and well-received eulogy.

## **Eric Stephen**

Eric Stephen died on March 30<sup>th</sup> 2005 at Colchester Hospital following complications after a lung operation.

Those of us who remember Eric initially knew him as a very slow bowler for Dale's Cricket Club but he was a frustrated batsman who, towards the end of his playing career, joined Southgate and proved that he was indeed eminently capable with a bat and steadied the Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> XI with distinction from 1979-86, scoring 1127 runs at an average of 17.33 and taking 117 wickets at 15.98. When he finally retired from playing he became a qualified umpire and moved to Essex where he performed his umpiring duties. He and his wife Pat (who predeceased him by eighteen months from breast cancer) would continue to pay occasional visits to Southgate for special lunches or President's Day until fairly recently.

Chris Sexton and John Williams attended Eric's funeral on behalf of Southgate Cricket Club.
