# THE 2009 SEASON

## *Ricky Gunn*

The news which overshadowed everything else at Southgate Cricket Club during the summer of 2009 was the sad passing of Jim Conroy. Jim had suffered from ill health over the last few years as cancer and its treatments took their toll but until the very end he was always pretty much his typical self, always interested in sport, constructively critical as ever, and very patient with the condition with which he found himself having to contend.

The cover picture shows Jim in familiar public speaking role, an activity that he happily fulfilled for many years using his dry Yorkshire wit and without the need for indecent language.

Jim's home town was Rotherham and his support for the football club was unstinting ("unbeaten in Europe!"). He was educated at the De La Salle College, Sheffield and attended Manchester University. He came to the south as an aircraft engineer working for De Havilland at Hatfield but decided to take up teaching Physics. On being posted to Enfield Grammar School he joined Southgate Cricket Club in 1956 as an opening bowler. His influence as 1st XI captain from 1973-75 paved the way for the achievements that were to follow under his successor Chris Payne.

Jim gave a lot of his time helping to run the club and acted as a Trustee to The Walker Association. For many years he played a key role in the Schools Cricket Association of Middlesex organising the inter-school knock-out competitions.

His competitive zeal extended to the golf course. He was a member at Bush Hill Park Golf Club which became the venue for the gathering after his funeral service at Our Lady of Mount Carmel & Saint George RC Church, Enfield.

His memory is enshrined in a semi-circular bench under the oak tree near the gate at The Walker Cricket Ground and also in an end of season local cricket competition to be played for the Jim Conroy Trophy.

## *So near yet so far*

The fortunes of the 1<sup>st</sup> XI in 2009 were a common talking point around the circuit during the season. Early predictions saw Southgate and South Hampstead vying for promotion to the Premier Division, with Brentham to be consigned to oblivion after the loss of key players. In the event, Southgate finished third and failed to make the leap, and South Hampstead were fortunate not to be relegated, with Brentham finishing next above them. Southgate's 2<sup>nd</sup> XI would have been disappointed at their 8<sup>th</sup> position, but still remain the only Southgate XI in a top division. The 3<sup>rd</sup> XI suffered the greatest ignominy of all by becoming relegated to the 3<sup>rd</sup> Division for the 2010 season, the first time a Southgate side has plumbed this depth. It is critical that this situation is redressed immediately, so player availability is the essential priority.

The fact that the 1<sup>st</sup> XI league side was so successful was all the more exceptional in that we lacked the luxury of a quality overseas player. Alvin Durgacharan, relieved of the pressure of captaincy, scored regularly to reach 560 league runs, very well supported by Jamie Jouning (497 runs) and Matt Creese, returning for the first time since 2005, with 488 runs and 20 wickets. Fawad Mullahzada took 28 wickets, and Rob Johnson (27 wickets and 212 runs) thrived in his role as the club's new captain. Tom Allan scored 432 runs with a big hundred against South Hampstead before being sidelined by an injury, and Ben Hartman 338.

As remarked above, the 2<sup>nd</sup> XI finished a slightly disappointing eighth. The club was fortunate this year to enjoy the services of Chris Falconer who scored 365 runs. Paddy Robinson scored 319 (including an unbeaten 127 against Brondesbury, and Jamie Wilson and Dave Woffinden also exceeded 200 runs. Woffers also took 26 wickets (at 11.76) and Adrian Carr 28.

The 3<sup>rd</sup> XI's 2008 promotion to the top division has been followed by two successive relegations. In 2010, therefore, we shall be playing in the third division, an unthinkable position for the club. It is critical that our availability improves dramatically so that an immediate reversal takes place. We cannot be destined to play for our lives against Kenton, Harrow Town or Wycombe House third XIs. Last year's newfound success, Simon Hughes took on the captaincy for 2009 but was beleaguered with unstable and inconsistent elevens. He scored 130 at North London but otherwise found runs harder to get. Older stalwarts Richard Bishop-Laggett (373 runs, including a maiden club hundred against Uxbridge) and Alan Jenner with 290 contributed the major share of the runs. Fionn Webb and Richard Marshall also exceeded 200 runs, while 16 year-old Partha Dave displayed considerable promise with 83 at home to North London. Arvind Shah bore by far the brunt of the bowling and earned himself 35 wickets at 16.82, getting five or more wickets four times with a best of 7-51 at North Middlesex. A sad finish for the 3<sup>rd</sup> XI for whom 48 players had represented the side this year – but 2 centuries, 10 fifties and 8 five+ wicket hauls was hardly evidential of a side bound for relegation.

The 4<sup>th</sup> XI spent the entire season in strong contention for promotion to Division 1 in the 1987 League but lost the last four games though double or quits efforts to win outright, ultimately finishing 4th. Roy Marett was the acquisition of the season and underlined the deficiency we

have suffered for years through not having an accurate new ball exponent, although at the age of 54 he was hardly part of the youth plan. Roy's 41 wickets at 11 apiece was a telling contribution and he was inevitably backed up by skipper Len Stokes with 34. Ricky Gunn scored 371 runs, Roy Marett 341 (average 87.25) and Doug Gordon 314. Lennie's fuller account later in this publication will fill in the details.

In July the club entertained the Sydney X Cricketers side which included Southgate veteran Martin van Rhoon and his son Connor. The latter two subsequently played a couple of League games each and Martin helped himself to a rapid 137 against a hapless North Middlesex 3<sup>rd</sup> XI.

Ricky Gunn, Len Stokes and Paul Lassman represented the 1987 League XI against other Middlesex clubs.

Alvin Durgacharan (well) exceeded 1,000 runs for the second time. Jamie Jouning scored 632 and Tom Allan 620. Partha Dave, Matt Creese and Ricky Gunn all exceeded 500. The top wicket takers, at the various levels of the club, were Len Stokes with 47, Roy Marett 41, and Rob Johnson 40. Career landmarks: Congratulations to Jamie Joining on passing 15,000 runs for Southgate, Alvin Durgacharan 10,000 (now 11,000) runs, Dave Woffinden 5,000 runs and 200 wickets, and Len Stokes on passing 600 wickets. The career averages section is gradually expanding and appears at the end of this Review.

During the winter Fionn Webb and Jamie Wilson qualified as Level One cricket coaches so we look forward to some fresh enthusiastic ideas in the colts' section next year.

## **Andy Nelson-Cole**

It is with great sadness that we announce the death of Andy Nelson-Cole who died peacefully in hospital on Saturday 28<sup>th</sup> March 2009. He was 65. To all those who knew him or played with him he was a larger than life character who brought great laughter and joy to those around him. The funeral service was held at Chelmsford Crematorium on 7<sup>th</sup> April.

# 4<sup>th</sup> XI League Report

## *Len Stokes*

As the dust settles on a tumultuous season for the Fourth XI we can reflect on what might have been. The season eventually hinged around four key games, some very tight decisions, some excellent cricket played by Southgate's version of Dads' and Lads' army, and some less-wonderful moments. Traditionally, Southgate's problem has been bowling sides out often enough to win the league. This problem is somewhat compounded by the excellence of the wickets prepared by Steve Martin (brilliant work yet again, thanks Steve) and the seemingly overwhelming desire of decent opposition batsmen to score runs on the back ground.

This year, however, the bowling was much stronger. So strong at times that the captain was spoilt for choice. Of the regular players, only Attwood and Gunn didn't turn their arm over. Having said that, it wasn't a case of the skipper giving everyone a game. I can't remember a time all summer when I didn't have the best bowlers bowling (or at least that was my opinion.) Everyone contributed in their own way. From young Jon Lauras' Herculean effort mid-season when all the seamers had a collective day off, to Marett and Turnbull haring in on the South Hampstead minefield in the second half of the season, there was never less than 100% effort with the ball. As captain, that's very gratifying.

The stats show that Marett (with 41 scalps) and Stokes (with 34) took over half the wickets between them (some might say that this was because they bowled two thirds of the time) and Roy's devastating spells against Brondesbury and Hanwell [*not forgetting eight at North London, Ed.*] will hopefully be rewarded at the League dinner. Cradock took 17 wickets and they always seemed to be key ones. Other bowlers, notably Hewit and Simms, held the bowling effort together, and apart from when the wheels nearly came off against North London at Ferme Park there wasn't a time all summer when I felt we were truly dominated. In the end we lost five games, two by the narrowest of margins, which we could easily have won.

As an aside, I still fail to understand how, year after year, we collectively underperform against Edmonton. We just seem to collectively not show up. Indeed my own personal performance was so poor in the first game that for the first time in 10 years the Club Secretary publicly admonished me for being "not very good today." Fierce criticism indeed for one so normally mild mannered. The batting department functioned adequately all season, with the return of the Depala boys towards the end of the season particularly praiseworthy. By the end of the season, they were occupying slots 1, 3 and 5 in the batting order and were always good for 90-100 runs between the three of them.

The two stars with the bat were Roy Marett and Ricky Gunn. Roy averaged 87 and was very efficient in the middle order when required. His 93 not out against North London allowed us the chance to attack for their entire innings and we would have looked in a very poor state without him. One of the two highlights of the season for me was Ricky's marvellous effort against the Tamils. out. There were also useful contributions with the bat from Doug Gordon and Luke Chipperfield early in the season. When called upon, the tail often wagged, most memorably away at Edmonton, when Stokes and Cradock led a counterattack that turned the game; Edmonton at home when Chipperfield (at 7) and Stokes at 9 put on an unbroken stand of 70 for the seventh wicket; and most significantly of all when Roy Marett nursed a badly bruised captain to a 50 run partnership for the tenth wicket at the South Hampstead artillery range.

The close catching this year was exemplary. Gunn was outstanding behind the stumps (because apparently this year the bowlers were putting it in the right place) and in the slips Cradock and Gordon took a series of excellent catches (and in Stuart's case some remarkable caught and bowleds). Occasionally the captain had the odd one that stuck, too. The biggest difference this year was the ground fielding. In previous year's Mike Stavri had been viewed as an outstanding fielder in our league. This season, Dan Simms, all three Depala boys and Mark Mallinson all soared past Mike's previously high benchmark, only to see Chris Attwood pull off a series of fielding demonstrations that wouldn't have looked out of place in the First XI. Chris's fielding was consistently outstanding but exceeded all possible expectations with an indescribably brilliant catch with his weak hand at extra cover in the Brondesbury game.

My other highlight of the summer. I need say no more. The overriding feeling is that the season was one of good fun, great camaraderie and a genuine communal desire to do your utmost for the other 10 lads on the pitch. While I'm thankful for everyone's efforts, I would particularly like to single out Ron Hewit and Paul Lassman, who both turned out at a moment's notice (literally) making the captain's job so much easier. Also, the ever present Delmore Walters. Del was available for every game the 4th team played and if he wasn't selected he was perfectly happy to umpire. Cricket clubs thrive on this sort of attitude. A public thank-you Del from the whole squad.

So what are the plans for next year? The fourth team is in good order.
